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

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Ruchi Anand is the Faculty Director at CEFAM and a full-Professor at the American Graduate School in Paris. An Indian-born academic and author, she has a decorated teaching record at several top Universities in the US and France.

She has authored and contributed to several books in the field of international relations and environmental politics including *Self Defense in International Relations*. New York: Palgrave MacMillan. 2009 and *International Environmental Justice: A North-South Dimension*. Aldershot, Hants, England; Burlington, VT: Ashgate. 2003. Dr Anand's research interests include international relations, international law, international organizations, environmental policy, business ethics, corporate social responsibility, foreign policy, politics of developing countries and women's studies.

What is your favorite class to teach?

My favorite class to teach is called 'Issues in international relations'. The course highlights the inescapable links between the abstract world of theories and the real world of policymaking; as also the links between the world of business and that of politics! The knowledge and tools of theories allow students to make sense of the storm of information that inundates us daily and prepares them for understanding the complex and ever-changing world in a systematic manner. Students learn the importance of a PESTEL (political, economic, social, technological, environmental, and legal)

analysis to identify challenges and opportunities in the world of business. They also learn about Geopolitical risk assessment (GRA) to better understand the macro environment of business. It is an intriguing and important class that allows students to better describe, prescribe, predict, and explain business decisions, strategies, innovations, successes, and failures. I love teaching this class since the international playing field is everchanging and thus exciting and new each time that I teach it. It's refreshing to hear out-of-the box innovative ideas from young minds who are our future leaders!

Have you been able to bring any professional experience to your classes?

Yes and no! I've been a die-hard academic for twenty years now! I have taught a variety of different subjects (i.e. international relations, geopolitics, international environmental law, international organizations, international non-governmental organizations, global governance, US foreign policy, gender and war, business ethics, corporate social responsibility, cross-cultural communication, international trade) at universities in three continents (Asia, Europe, North America); with students of over 50 nationalities; and with extensive networks through research, teaching, publishing and consulting. I try to bring this inter-disciplinary, non-parochial vision to my classes to allow students to get the big picture and the use-value for the hard and soft skills that they acquire in their classes that are indispensable to their success in the real-world!

What do you enjoy most about working at CEFAM?

What I enjoy most about CEFAM is its diversity and international character! It's fun to be working, teaching, and learning every day in an 'academic melting-pot' with like-minded people, all on borderlands in some or another way. Perhaps, that's what CEFAMily means.

How have you been able to bring your professional experience to your classes?

There is no right or wrong answer in law; it is all about how well you can convince your audience. What is your favorite class to teach?


My favorite class to teach is also the only one I teach at CEFAM: Sales Management and Negotiations.
